LENT 2023 – The Journey has begun! The holy season of Lent is an exceptional gift given to us by the church to journey more deeply into the experience of God's love. Jesus shows us the way. Throughout this season we will find him in prayer, fighting off temptations and immersing himself in the Father's love as he completes the plan to win salvation for souls. We are invited to enter into the two movements of this season with Jesus. First we are invited to remove from our lives those things or thoughts that separate us from God. By fasting and fostering a generous heart we practice detachment from things and stuff while seeking deeper attachment to the Source of all life, Our Father. Prayer strengthens this attachment as we spend time with God in our inner rooms and in communal opportunities of worship and praise. As we nurture this beautiful gift of Union we then participate in the second part of the journey. We are commissioned to take the love the Father has for us and allow it to overflow into our world. Our words convey the message of good news to those in our circle of influence and our actions back up those words as we use our resources to lift up those around us.

Reflection and Action Item: Lent 2023 is not a spectator sport, we are all invited to participate in the opportunity for individual prayer (Praying the rosary and the Psalms each day) as well as communal worship (Sunday Mass, Stations of the Cross, One Voice Concert).
