

Fourth Sunday of Easter Jesus is Risen!. Alleluia! Thank you, God, for the gift of your Son!

In this fourth week of Easter the scriptures give us a growing picture of how the Holy Spirit is guiding the early community of believers. Peter's preaching is full of fire and it is effective in bringing many into the fold by accepting baptism. Sunday's gospel moves us to reflect on Jesus as the gate, the gatekeeper. People may look to find salvation in a variety of ways. As disciples of Jesus we look to find salvation through the work of our shepherd and following him. In the tenth chapter of the Gospel of John, Jesus describes the intimate relationship he has with us: "I know my own and mine know me." We recognize his voice and we follow him.

I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. A thief comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy; I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly."

We Pray Good and gracious Lord, we thank you for your role as gate and shepherd. We are blessed to be your lambs led on the path of everlasting life in You. Through Your death we have eternal life, free from the grasp of robbers and thieves. Thank you for being the single Way to get us to our desired destination.

<u>FIRST HOLY COMMUNION</u> Next Sunday our parish family will celebrate First Holy Communion as four members of our parish family approach the Table of the Lord to receive the precious body and Blood of our Lord. As they make their final preparations this week for this sacramental encounter with Jesus, please keep them and their families in your prayers. Inflame my heart with the fire of Your love, my Lord and Savior.

Easter 2023 As we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord for the next seven weeks we will mark the Ascension forty days after Easter and conclude the feast with Pentecost on the fiftieth day after Easter. We begin the deepening realization of, and reflection upon, the meaning of

the gift of life we have received in God's raising Jesus from the dead so that we might have eternal life.

St. Paul invites us to live in this passing world with our hearts set on the world that will never end. This week let us try to open our hearts to a felt sense of what a difference it makes that the tomb is empty, that Jesus is alive, that he allows us to recognize him in the breaking of bread, and that he missions us to proclaim this Good News.

As we begin each day this week, we can simply thank God for our being alive today. Even more, we can thank God for the life that Jesus won for us. Throughout the day, and at different brief moments, we can remember that this is Easter Week and ask to live more freely today, more gratefully. We can name the grace in our own terms and in the context of what we are experiencing, what gets us discouraged or what gives us life. Overall, we want to live the freedom we have been given. If death has no hold on us, so many of our fears would melt away. If we realized our ultimate home is in heaven, our spirits would be lighter and we would walk around more gratefully.

So, as we go through this week, we can let ourselves believe in the Resurrection that was won for us. "Lord, I believe in the gift of life you have given me in the death and resurrection of your Son, Jesus." We can say this act of faith, or sing any of the wonderful Easter songs in the back of our minds, as many times as it takes to let ourselves feel the effects of Easter. Reflection and Action Item: Easter is a season of joy and alleluia! It is a time to celebrate the Resurrection of our savior, Jesus Christ. It is a time to rejoice in the gift of encounter.
