TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME God's love belongs to all of us, according to the readings of the Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time. In Isaiah, God promises "my house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples." Paul, in his Letter to the Romans, tells us "the gifts and the call of God are irrevocable" and refers to himself as the "apostle to the Gentiles." In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus hears the pleas of a "foreign" woman, a Canaanite who begs Jesus to heal her daughter.

This week we can be moved by the powerful faith of the Canaanite women. We are all presented with challenges to being a person of faith. For many of us, our daily prayers are asking God to bless us with more freedom and more independence. When our priorities are in line as disciples of Jesus our prayer will match up with what "success" really means for us. Like the Canaanite women we may adjust our focus away from self and on to others with a renewed dependence and trust in God's power to heal and save us.

We pray for the grace to find intimacy with God in the midst of our busy everyday lives. May our own faith be deepen as we learn from the faith of the Canaanite woman!


the new school year!
