

<u>FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT</u> On the First Sunday of Lent, as we begin our Lenten journey, remembering how God re-established the covenant after the flood, and we reflect on how Jesus began his public ministry with a retreat of forty days - driven to the desert by the Spirit.

This first week of Lent is the time we are given to begin our Lenten patterns, to re-align our priorities, and to make use of more reflective time each day. It is a time to fast and abstain from those things that hinder our relationship with the Lord, and to consider being more generous to the poor.

As we make this beginning, we are offered some beautiful instruction about what is expected of us. These readings describe a very Jesus-like love. We can examine our care for the hungry, thirsty, naked, sick or imprisoned. We can reflect upon who in our lives needs us and whether we love them as we want to be loved. And we can look at the deeper things, like our anger or how we treat others, and our response to those who are our "enemies." What is most important this first week, beyond a sharper examination of our consciences, is to see this as a time for God's grace to work in us. So, it is a time to ask for the graces we are starting to see we need.

Throughout the day, we talk with our Lord, in the background about these graces we ask for and the concrete circumstances we find ourselves in. It is in the particular events of our day that we will become attentive to our need for our Lord's presence and grace, as well as our need to choose a new pattern.

THE SEASON OF LENT The great season of Lent begins on Wednesday, February 14. On Fridays in Lent our parish will gather on Friday evenings at 5:00 PM to walk with Jesus as we pray the Stations of the Cross. This mini pilgrimage allows us to reflect more deeply on his life and the salvation that the Son of God brought to the world. Mark your calendars now for Friday, March 15 for our annual Youth and Family Stations of the Cross which will be followed by a Pizza Social with the pizza provided by Dough Boys! On Friday March 8 we will join with All Saints Parish in Carnegie and pray together the traditional Bitter Lamentations of Jesus and his mother, Mary.

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING. Each year the parish community gathers for our annual parish meeting. In this meeting we review the past year and the work we have done to serve one another and bring the good news of Jesus to our community. We discuss our concerns and set goals for the new year. We set up our budget and also elect the parish committee. Over the past year we are grateful for the service our committee has provided to the parish. Members of the committee are committed to the parish and are willing to continue to serve. All members of the parish are encouraged to get involved and to put their skills to good use in the parish. We are grateful for her service on the committee and remain grateful that she will continue to serve the children and youth of our parish through her work with the School of Christian living.
